### **3rd Grade Summer Reading 2025**

This summer, the students will continue working on their reading and writing skills by engaging in a summer reading assignment.

**Students must choose a book prior to the end of the school year, and have it approved by their classroom teacher. The book chosen should meet the guidelines listed below.**

After a book has been selected and approved, the students will read and complete a 'One-Pager' (examples are included) with the information listed below. Please complete the assignment and have it to turn in on the **first day of school** in September. Late assignments are subject to a 5% grade deduction per day.

#### **Reading Choice Guidelines**

- **Must be a chapter book.**
- **Must be appropriate for the students current reading level/ability**
- **Must have a minimum of 70 pages.**
- **Graphic Novels or Comic books will NOT be allowed**

#### **Assignment**

The student will complete a 'One-Pager' on the fiction book they have chosen to read. (Approval required by current 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher). The 'One-Pager' requirements are listed below, and examples have been provided.

#### **Format**

The 'One-Pager' needs to be completed on an 8 ½ x 11 piece of plain white paper. You may use crayons, markers, or colored pencils for the illustration.

*This assignment will serve as your first Reading Comprehension grade for the 2025-2026 school year. This assignment will be due on the first day of school, Wednesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>.*

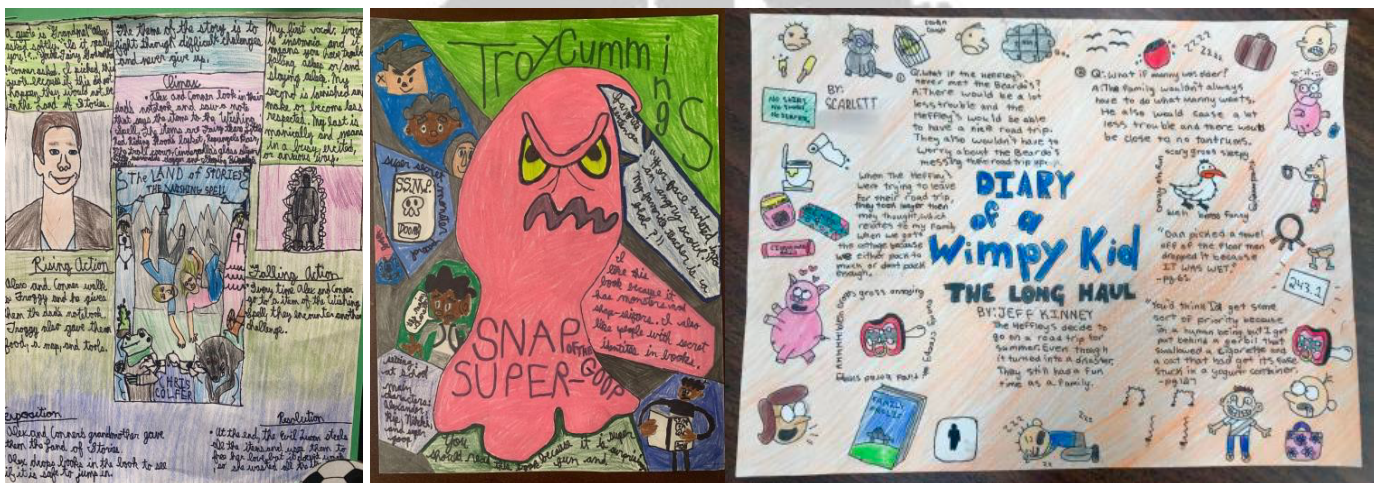
**3<sup>rd</sup> Grade 'One Pager': Your One-Pager MUST include all the items below. You may place them wherever you want and design your One-Pager however you see fit.**

### **REQUIRED ELEMENTS:**

Arrange the following **REQUIRED ELEMENTS** on the page in any way you choose (**ALL** are required for full points). You must include the **BOLD** bullet point title with each section.

- Your name
- **Title and Author** of the book
- **Summary** (details of story): Don't forget to include the conflict (problem in the story), and resolution (how the problem was solved) in your summary: must be written in 3-5 complete and detailed sentences
- **Theme:** What was the theme of the story? (written in a complete sentence)
  - Reminder- The theme is 'the message' of the story; For example: Friendship or courage
- **Character Analysis:** Write the name of the main character and list 3 character traits the character(s) showed throughout the story.
- **Vocabulary:** List at least 3 words you learned from your story and their definition.
- **Important Quote:** Write a quote from the text that you thought was important to the story and tell why this quote is important.
