

4th Grade Summer Reading 2025

This summer, the students will continue working on their reading and writing skills by engaging in a summer reading assignment.

Students must choose TWO books prior to the end of the school year, and have them approved by their current classroom teacher. The books chosen MUST meet the guidelines listed below.

Reading Choice Guidelines

- One book must be fiction and the other non-fiction.
- Fiction book must be a chapter book with at least 100 pages.
- Non-fiction book must be at least 75 pages.
- Each must be appropriate for the students current reading level/ability
- Graphic Novels or Comic books will NOT be allowed

Please complete the assignments below and have them ready to turn in on the first day of school on Wednesday, September 3rd.

Late assignments are subject to a 10% grade deduction per day.

Reading Assignments

FICTION: complete a one-pager for your fiction novel. The one-pager needs to be completed on an 8 ½ x 11 piece of plain white printer paper. You may choose to use crayons, markers, or colored pencils for the illustrations and decorations.

NON-FICTION: complete the attached Informational Text Response for your non-fiction book. This should be completed in pencil in your neatest handwriting.

This assignment will serve as your first Language Arts grade for the 2025-2026 school year.

It is your first opportunity to make an impression on your new teacher.

Assignment #1: One-Pager for FICTION Text

Your One-Pager MUST include all the items below. You may place them wherever you want and design your One-Pager however you see fit.

REQUIRED ELEMENTS:

Arrange the following <u>REQUIRED ELEMENTS</u> on the page in any way you choose (ALL are required for full points). You must include the BOLD bullet point title with each section.

- o Your name
- o **Title** and **Author** of the book
- o **Plot, Conflict**, and **Resolution**: must be written in 3-5 complete and detailed sentences
- Theme: What was the theme of the story? (written in a complete sentence)
- Character Development: How did the main character(s) change throughout the story? List 2 character traits the character(s) showed at the beginning of the story and tell how they changed by the end.
- o Vocabulary: List at least 3 words you learned from your story and their definition.
- Important Quote: Write a quote from the text that you thought was important to the story and tell why this quote is important.
